Manx Music, Speech and Dance Festival – April 2018

The Band enjoyed much success at the recent Manx Music, Speech and Dance Festival ('the Guild'). The weekend commenced with young cornet player Beth Coole participating in the Guild for the first time. Playing Elgar's Pomp & Circumstance, Beth achieved a great mark of 87. Beth left with a distinction certificate and an ice-cream for her efforts!!

Following this, and in the Adult Solo class, lead euphonium player Martin Norbury and front row cornet player Ashley Cole finished 1st and 2nd respectively, with 90 and 89 marks. A great achievement for them both and lovely to see them raising the profile of the Band with their success.



On the Sunday night of the Festival, the brass bands all took to the stage. Our Band played extremely well. The concert programme consisted of 'Island Whirl' (solo by Principal Cornet player Matthew Callister), 'First Light' (solo by Ashley Cole), 'Hunt the Wren', 'I Wanna Be Like You' (solo by William King) and 'Conquest Of Paradise'.



The Band were ranked third with their hymn (Swedish Folk Song) and first with their march (Star Lake); which gave an overall position of second for the combined 'march & hymn' category.

The overall entertainment category saw the Band with another excellent result, finishing in second place.

In addition to this, bass trombone player William King was awarded the best solo prize for his rendition of 'I Wanna Be Like You'. Congratulations to William on his award.

Following on from all of this, the Band members are currently having a well-earned week off. We'd like to take the opportunity to thank all the players, their families, our


Concert for Didds
