## Manx Music, Speech and Dance Festival – April 2022

After the events of the past couple of years where the Festival had to be cancelled due to the Covid pandemic, the Band members were only too pleased to spend time practising music for the 2022 festival.

The Festival started on the Saturday morning with a number of the Band taking part in the solo classes. Lucas Roome from Ballafesson Brass got things started in the Promenade Suite and received a mark of 82 (Merit) for his performance (Class up to year 6), whilst his brother Cameron, also from Ballafesson Brass, earned a mark of 84 (Commended) in Class years 9 and 10. Senior Band players Lucy Norbury and James Kinley then participated in the solo class for years 11 to 13, and both received a mark of 86 (Commended) for their efforts. Finally Ashley Cole received a mark of 88 (Distinction) in the solo class for adult players. A great efforts from all five players and good to see members from RSB taking part on the solo classes showing the quality of players we have.

On the Sunday night of the Festival, six of the Island's brass bands took to the stage. RSB played extremely well, and were pleased to receive 2<sup>nd</sup> place with a score of 88 (Distinction) for the march (Belmont) and 2<sup>nd</sup> place with a score of 87 (Distinction) for the hymn (Love Divine). The concert



programme consisted of Birdland, All in the April Evening, Napoli (solo by Principal Euphonium player Martin Norbury), When I'm Sixty Four, and From Newlyn to Niarbyl. The Band were delighted to receive a score of 91 (Outstanding) and second overall in the Entertainment Class.

Many thanks to our compere for the night, Mike Kewley, who ably guided the Band's programme. Thank you to all those who contributed to the Band's and solo players entry in the Guild this year. Most of all though, the biggest thank you goes to our Musical Director John Kinley for all his hard work and patience.

### **Prash Laxaa Festival 2022**

On Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> May, the Band were again delighted to be invited to take part in this year's Great Laxey Brass Band Festival or Prash Laxaa, around a number of locations in the village of Laxey.

After a wet morning, the weather started to brighten up as soon as the first bands started playing at 1pm. Rushen Silver Band played a 25 minute set at three venues - the Laxey Pavilion, the Miner's Statue and finally at the Mines Tavern. With a varied programme of 'Birdland', 'Georgia on My Mind', 'Belmont', 'Going Home' and 'From Newlyn to Niarbyl', the audience at each venue seemed thoroughly entertained.

The Festival saw six bands playing at the three venues and changing every half hour. The audiences at each venue were able to appreciate the quality of the brass bands on






the Island, and enjoyed the sunshine! The afternoon culminated with all the bands assembling into one massed band with the various conductors sharing the baton.

## **Mona's Queen II Memorial Service**

The Mona's Queen Memorial Service will this year take place on Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> May at 1.30pm at Kallow Point, Port St Mary.

The Mona's Queen was one of the first vessels to make a successful round trip during the Dunkirk evacuation in 1940, but just two days later on the 29<sup>th</sup> May, the ship struck a magnetic sea mine outside Dunkirk harbour early in the morning, and sank in two minutes with the loss of twenty four of the crew.

The service held each year on the same date is held in memory of those that lost their lives, and we're hoping with the early afternoon start that the weather will be kind to us all when this is taking place.

#### **Celebration Concert for Jim Crebbin**

On Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> May, the Band will be performing a concert at Rushen Primary School at 3pm to celebrate the life of Jim Crebbin, who sadly passed away in 2021 in his 90<sup>th</sup> year.



Jim was a serving member of the band for 76 years, and in that time, was also conductor of the band for 50 years. Jim was also both a Life Member and a Trustee for many years, and was at one point Chairman too, but was extremely honoured to be given the title of Conductor Emeritus in the 2000s and the British Empire Medal in 2015 for his services to music as well as the local community.

The music for the concert has been chosen by members of Jim's family, and will reflect the music the band have played since becoming Rushen Silver Band in 1949, and will hopefully include pieces for the audience on the day to enjoy.

Admission to the concert will be free, with any donations being given going to Band funds. There will also be refreshments available after the concert for everyone to enjoy and take time to reminisce Jim's life as part of the band family.

## **Remembering Richard Evans**

The Band are very sad to report that our Musical Advisor for the past twenty years, and brass band luminary, Richard Evans, sadly passed away in April aged 87.



Mr Evans was a good friend to the Band since his first visit in 2002, and a mentor to all the players of RSB and Ballafesson Brass each time he was on the Island. He was always very entertaining on his visits to the Island, as I'm sure every audience will confirm, but he was also always serious about performing and playing the music at all times.

There are too many memories to list here, but we have no doubt Mr Evans will live on through the music of all the players and bands he inspired. May he rest in peace. Oie Vie.
