To start off what looks like being a very busy 2023, the Band held a Fundraising Concert for a local charity, Rushen Endowment Fund, on Monday 6th February. Principal Cornet, Ashley Cole, conducted the first half of the programme which included the march "Standard of St George", "The Sprit Within", "Northern Lights" and finished with sound track highlights from the Disney film 'Brave'.





To commence the second half, Musical Director John Kinley conducted the Band through "Fanfare for a New Age", which was followed by a number of pieces including "Lullabye (Goodnight My Angel)" by Billy Joel, Queen hit "Crazy Little Thing Called Love", "Bare Necessities" bass solo performed by Eb Bass player Tom Sinden, and finished the concert with the powerful piece "Elsa's Procession to the Cathedral" from Lohengrin.

It is pleasing to say that £500 was raised on the night for Rushen Endowment Fund, and both the Band and the Fund are very appreciative for the generosity of the

audience on the night. The Band have now moved on to working toward their musical programme for this year's Manx Music Festival ('The Guild') taking place at the end of April.

But before we close last year's book, let's look back at a busy festive period. After all that happened in December 2021 with COVID-19 and inclement weather, the Band were pleased that everything went to plan during the 2022 festive period.

Starting the festivities on the Friday night was an informal Christmas Concert from Ballafesson Brass at the Erin Arts Centre with a fun programme which was well received by a good size audience – Matthew Callister conducted Ballafesson Brass wearing an impressive Christmas suit and other Band members sported their festive jumpers.

On the Saturday, the Senior Band performed two Christmas Concerts in one day, both to a sell-out crowd! We were particularly pleased that the Island's Lieutenant Governor and Lady Lorimer joined us for the afternoon concert. Thanks are also extended to Paul Costain who, along with performing his own pieces, joined the Band for renditions of "Lonely This Christmas", as well as "Mistletoe and Wine".

Following this great start, the Band then moved on to events for Port St Mary Commissioners, Port Erin Traders, Ballafesson Chapel, Port St Mary RNLI, Ballasalla School, PSM WI, Port Erin Commissioners, St Columba's

Church, and Southlands Resource Centre. Around these events, the Band also played carols around areas of Port Erin and Port St Mary totalling six sessions.

After talking about it for a number of years, we were finally able to sort out a Carol Train. With 175 people and about 25 of the Band on board, we used the train to stop at Port St Mary, Colby, Castletown and Port Erin Stations to hold an informal carol singing event at each. The event was a great success, and it is hoped something similar and maybe even better can take place in December 2023. Thanks go to IOM Railways, the Railway Supporters, the Whistle Stop Cafe, and of course all those who joined us on the train and joined in the carol singing along the way.

The members of the Band would again like to thank everyone who generously made a donation over the festive period, and to those supporters who kindly gave their time to help collect money whilst the Band played carols. Of course, and to finish, a special thank you should be extended to the families of the Band members for their support and patience during this very busy time.
