

Manx Music, Speech and Dance Festival – April 2023

The 2023 "Guild" will be one that will live long in the memory of all the players who were part of the senior band at this year's Festival.

To begin with though, the Festival started on the Saturday morning with a number of the Band taking part in the solo classes. Lucas Roome, a member of Ballafesson Brass, got things going in the Promenade Suite and received a mark of 83 (Merit) for his performance in the Brass Solo (Up to Year 6) Class. Following him in the same class was Aelan Morgans, also a Ballafesson Brass player, who received a mark of 87 (Distinction) and received the 1st prize. Congratulations to Aelan for a great performance. RSB are very proud to see younger members success.



Following on from this, Kyla Williams performed in the Brass Solo (Years 11 to 13) and received a praiseworthy mark of 84 (Commended) and 2nd place in her class. In the Brass Solo (Adult), Ashley Cole received a mark of 91 (Outstanding) whilst Jonathan King was awarded 86 (Commended) for his performance. Congratulations to all our soloists for taking part and for the high standard of their performances.

On the Sunday night of the Festival week, six of the Island's brass bands took to the stage in the Royal Hall at the Villa Marina, Douglas. RSB played extremely well, and were pleased to receive a score of 87 (Distinction) for our march ("Richard Evans", composed by Alan Fernie) and joint 2nd place with a score of 89 (Distinction) for our hymn ("Stella" arr. Alan Fernie). The Band's concert programme consisted of Fanfare For A New Age, Stardust (solo by Principal Trombone player James Kinley), Crazy Little Thing Called Love, On the Track (Xylophone solo by Percussionist Ellie Matthews), and finished with "Going Home".

The Band were delighted to receive a mark of 91 (Outstanding) for their performance, and for the first time in the Band's history, won the Entertainment Class with what adjudicator Kathryn Page described as "a really high level performance".

The Band would like to thank compere for the night, Mike Kewley, who

skilfully guided the Band's programme, and a big thank you to our Musical Director John Kinley for all his hard work and patience. We hope some of you were there on the night to hear the Band play and also enjoy with us receiving a first prize in the Entertainment Class that the Band have been trying to win for more years than most of us care to remember.

Mona's Queen III Memorial Service

The Mona's Queen III Memorial Service will this year take place on Monday 29th May at 2pm at Kallow Point, Port St Mary.

The Mona's Queen was one of the first vessels to make a successful round trip during the Dunkirk evacuation in 1940 but just two days later on the 29th May, the ship struck a magnetic sea mine outside Dunkirk harbour early in the morning, and sank in two minutes with the loss of twenty four of the crew.

The service held each year on the same date is held in memory of those that lost their lives, and we're hoping with the early afternoon start that the weather will be kind to us all whilst this is taking place.



Prash Laxaa Festival 2023

On Sunday 30th April, the Band were pleased to once again be part of the Great Laxey Brass Band Festival or 'Prash Laxa' for 2023 which, as in previous years, took place around a number of locations in the village of Laxey.

After an inclement weather forecast was



given for the day, and even though there was a little drizzle during the Band's first short concert at the Laxey Glen Gardens Pavilion, it didn't take long to brighten up and was even quite warm by the time the event finale took place. As well as the Pavilion, the Band also played a short set at the Mines Tavern pub and also the Village Square with a varied programme that included the march "Richard Evans", "Stardust", "Crazy Little Thing Called Love", "Bring Him Home", "On The Track", and "Going Home".
